## The Wānaka Heart Steering Group


Our cross sector steering group working on a volunteer basis is directing the production of a community supported masterplan, looking after the process, the consultation and overviewing the content




### What area are we looking at?







Parking investigation studies, disability access and Brownston arterial treatment



Linked up traffic calmed street network




New landuse mix, density and height provisions
